Colors of the World with Mr. Erik

We bought some new colored pencils from Crayola that have 24 different colors of skin tone. We decided to use the new supplies as a conversation starter about diversity. Four kids decided to join Mr. Erik for his activity and compare the shades of pencils to their own skin.

Erik: "How did you decide which color you were?"

Selah: "I started with a dark color and just kept going lighter."

Amelia: "I did the same thing that she did. Well actually I started with the light color and just kept going darker."

Ozzi: "My color is kinda dark because I play in the sun a lot with my friends."

Sophia: "I chose different pencils and held them up to my skin until I found the right one."

Erik: "Did you ever notice what colors we had for skin with the other colored pencils?"

Ozzi: "White, black, brown, pink."

Erik: "Let's check the colored pencil bin and see what colors we usually have."

(Kids rummage through our colored pencil bin and take out the colors we normally use to color people.)

Erik, holding out the white, black, brown and pink pencils, "So, which pile has more colors?"

Selah: "The new pencils have way more colors, there are 24 different colors."

Erik: "Do you think you can find your skin tone using just these four colors? Using only white, black, brown and pink?" **Sophia:** "No, I can't find my color anymore."

Ozzi: "I like the new ones more. There are a lot of choices."

Erik: "I'm just thinking about all the people in the world that don't have those four colors of skin."

Selah: "It's better to have more colors so we can find the right one."

Erik: "How do you think it would feel if you couldn't find the right color for your skin?"

Ozzi: "That would be kinda weird. Kinda embarrassing."

Erik: "So what do you think the lesson is from this activity I'm doing with you all?"

Selah: "That we are all different and we all have different colors of skin."

Erik: "Yes. My point is that all of us are different and all of us have different colors of skin. Even if you think to yourself, 'I'm white,' what does that mean? Are any of us as white as the white colored pencil?"

Sophia: "None of us are. We are all different colors and that is what makes us special."
