The kids chose the outcomes and events of the story line along the way. In the future they want to do a similar activity where they are faced with an obstacle to overcome. Josh (7): We made a steering wheel for our ship so we need to be in the front. Leo (6): What about pirates? We need to make sure to make swords to fight them off. Aya (10): Oh no, man over board! Naya (10): We all need to work together, guys, and listen to each other. Peter (5): Hey Leo! I want to help you build your boat and make swords.

Finger Weaving with Adelaide (9)

This week we did an activity called finger weaving lead by Adelaide. Finger weaving is a skill that lasts a lifetime. You learn it once and never forget it, kind of like riding a bike! Giants, Elves, Wizards, Dragons, Dwarves & Goblins with Diego (11)

This week we expanded on the kid favorite *Giants, Elves, & Wizards*. A quick summary of the rules:

- •Two teams line up, facing each other.
- •They then huddle up secretly and pick one of three avatars (Giant, Elf, or Wizard) to represent.

•Once a decision is made, they face each other and display their choice, of which will either win, lose, or tie against the other (a la Rock-Paper-Scissors).

•The team that displays the victorious avatar chases the members of the other team, trying to tag them before they reach their predetermined SAFE zone. If a player is tagged, they become part of the other team.


One reason the game is so popular is because it rewards both athletic ability and strategic thinking. However, like Rock-Paper-Scissors, it can grow stale rather quickly.

To remedy this, the regulars from past games were reached out to and given the proposition of expanding the number of avatars from three to six. Once that was accepted, we picked out three new avatars (Dragon, Dwarf, Goblin) and then went about establishing what each avatar beat, lost to, and tied with. After an iteration or two, we balanced it out so each avatar had two wins, losses, and ties (which includes itself.). At that point, we realized that there were too many avatar interactions to keep track of.

That led us to creating a poster that showcased a diagram of what beats what. This created the opportunity for the kids to draw pictures of the fantasy creatures that are our avatars. Thanks in large part to the immaculate art skills of **DIEGO**, we were able to essentially create a massive cheat sheet for the players to reference while playing the game.

When the day finally came to play, it went well with maximum participation. The additional choices provided more variety and delayed the eventual decline in strategic thinking that came when playing with three avatars, though it did complicate the process of immediately knowing who won the round. Here is some of the feedback I got about the evolution of the game: **Eric (10):** What if there was an obstacle course that kids had to run through to get to their safe zone. **Maddie (11):** There's too much down time in between rounds. **Breen (8):** Having six choices made it too complicated.

Overall, this expansion of a kid favorite was mostly successful. I find that active activities usually don't draw the less athletic kids and my main reason for expanding this activity was to rectify that. I wanted to create a game where they had to use their brain as much, if not more than, their body. And while adding three additional avatars did do that, it did not do it enough in my opinion. I do have ideas to expand the cerebral aspect of the game for future iterations and will reach out to the regulars to prototype them.
