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Tag Takes Over Again!





Juanita introduced another new version of tag called Tunnel Tag, to the kids. "It was great watching them play a classic tag game that I grew up playing ... and that they loved it," said Juanita It's a mix of regular tag and freeze tag. When tagged, they create a tunnel with their legs for the others to try to crawl through and unfreeze them.

We used the Sky-Blue rhyme technique to see who would be "it." The kids loved that part too because of the anticipation of knowing who'd end up being chosen. We'd switch it up to keep it fresh and choose a new "it." They really enjoyed the rotation of taggers because everyone would eventually have a chance to be "it". As the game progressed, the kids were catching on to tricks to get their friends back into the game without getting tagged themselves. "You guys need to spread out your legs wider so we can just slide through," said Elliot, as he tried to get his team moving faster. "I'm scared to do that though because you're going to come running straight at me and I'm afraid you're going to knock me down," replied Mason.
