
Josh- "Definitely would like to do it in the dark."

Culture Club has made its way to Mexico!

To kick off the club, we started with a few rounds of Culture Club bingo: Mexican food and snack edition. The bingo card consisted of traditional dishes like Mole and Posole, along with snacks and deserts like Conchas and Elote. This gave the kids an opportunity to learn and recognize some dishes that they may have already seen or not. We had three winners: Drake, Aiyonna, and Kinsley. Each of them won a CC Coupon which allowed them tech time, free pass for clean up, and a bring your own snack pass.

To further our familiarity, we joined Osuna and their Culture Club and had a field trip to The Golden Crown Panaderia. Most of the kids, including myself, had never been before but were super excited to try some new treats. When we arrived, there was plenty of outdoor seating that we took advantage of and I began to take them inside in groups to pick out their snacks. We tried their pizzas, empanadas, biscochito cookies, wedding cake cookies, lattes, smoothies, and more assorted pastries and cookies. The staff was super accommodating to our large group and the kids enjoyed their snacks.

Lena: "I ordered 2 regular biscochitos, 2 chocolate biscochitos, and 2 wedding cookies. My favorite so far has been the chocolate ones."

After eating our way through Mexico, we decided to explore crafts next. I presented Ojo de Dios, "God's Eye", which is a spiritual and votive object made by weaving a design out of yarn upon a wooden cross. They are commonly found in Mexican indigenous and Catholic peoples and were woven to protect their children, prayers for a long life, and protection of their crops.

The kids were a little nervous about the designs and their capabilities of weaving but once we started and I demonstrated how simple it could be, they dove right in and had a blast.

Julissa: "I don't know if I am going to be able to make this but I am excited to try!"

Aiyonna: "I have made these before in my class and they are much easier than I thought. III help those who have any questions!"

Damian: "This activity is actually really easy and the weaving is relaxing. Can I take some yarn home to practice this at home?"







We ended Culture Club: Mexico with learning how to make guacamole and salsa verde. The kids love to cook and prep ingredients so we had multiple stations of tomato cutting, jalapenos, avocados, limes, and onions. We also had kids stewing tomatoes, onions, and peppers on the stove for salsa and then blending everything up in a blender. Some thought that the salsa was spicy others did not, but they enjoyed their dips with tortilla chips.
