

Monique was able to schedule a presentation through the University of New Mexico Acapella Choir! This Choir is different from others, because they have their very own Beat-Boxer, who was excited to share his knowledge with all the kids!

This presentation was different from presentations in the past because it was virtually. Dakson was our main presenter, and was very knowledgeable with how to create different sounds while beat-boxing.
