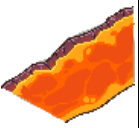
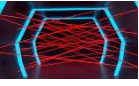

But they also enjoyed cleaning up and separating all the colors back into the bins. "That was actually pretty satisfying." - Ansen



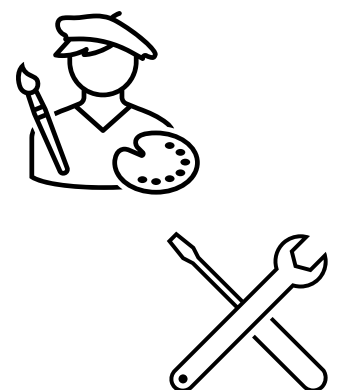
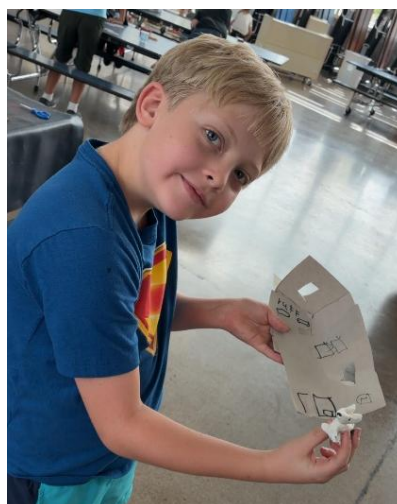
A World of Creativity

Clay Creations
