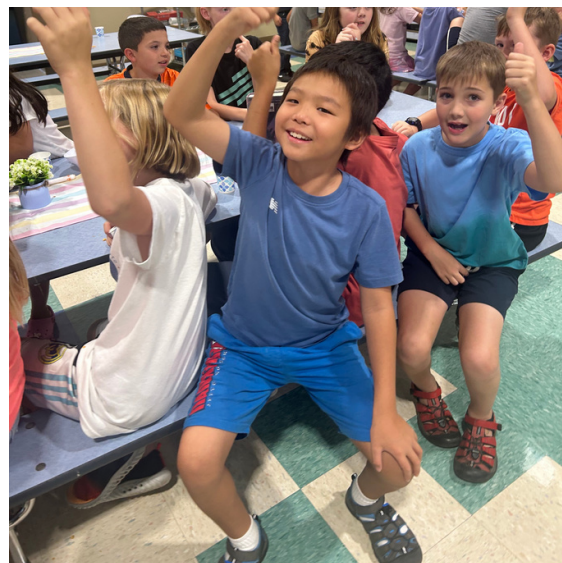
Wolf Pack Spotlight
