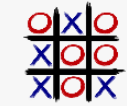

Crystal Chemistry

During our crystal-growing experiment, the kids measured and prepared their own materials. They measured the water and Epsom salt, carefully added the salt to the water, and observed what happened as they stirred the mixture. The kids noticed that the Epsom salt dissolved into the water as they stirred it and discussed where they thought the salt was going. They then shaped pipe cleaners into different designs and put them into the solution. The kids learned about measurement, dissolving, mixtures, and how crystals form. They practiced important science skills like observing, predicting, questioning, comparing, and describing changes.



Obstacle Course

Today, the students participated in an obstacle course on the playground. They were divided into teams, which helped encourage teamwork, communication, and cooperation. The students were eager to get started with the competition and were excited to cheer on their teammates. Throughout the activity, they worked together, encouraged one another, and showed good sportsmanship. 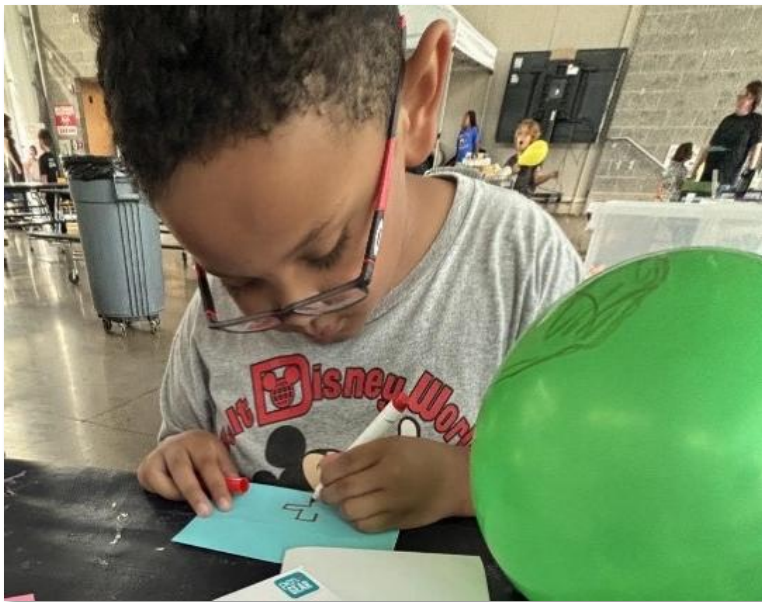


Helping Hands Thankful Hearts
